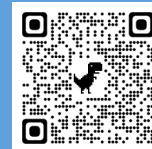

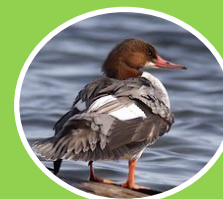

- ✓ The walk will be between **2~4 hours**, depending on what we find! Plan to walk slowly and make frequent stops.
- ✓ We will walk the lake in a **counter-clockwise direction** (so you can catch up if you miss the 8 AM start time).
- ✓ **Dress in layers**, it's better to shed than to shiver!
- ✓ **Avoid bright red outer layers** (red is an alarming color to most birds)
- ✓ Bring **binoculars** if you have them.
- ✓ Please, **NO DOGS** however well-behaved!
